

Local Golf Rules

The USGA Rules of Golf govern all play. The Committee has established the following Local Rules.

- Stones in bunkers may be removed as *movable obstructions* (see Rule 24-1).
- If a player's ball lies in an area marked as *ground under repair*, or if it interferes with the player's stance or the area of his intended swing, the player must take relief (see Rule 25-1).
- For the purpose of Rule 25-3 *Wrong Putting Green*, the #3/#12 green includes the apron surrounding it. If the ball comes to rest on the green, when taking relief, the ball must be dropped clear of the apron.

Hole Specific:

- 1 / 10 * The steps to the left of the green are not obstructions. They are an integral part of the course. There is no relief.
- 4 / 13 * The split-rail fence bordering the parking lot defines *Out of Bounds*.
- * A ball landing in the cart storage area is to be played as *Ball Lost in Immovable Obstruction* (see Rule 24-3b). Relief is one club length.
- 6 / 15 * The fence behind the green defines *Out of Bounds*. If the fence causes the player to deem the ball unplayable, the player may, as an additional option, drop a ball, under penalty of one stroke, in the dropping zone.
- 7 / 16 * The pond surrounding the green is a *Lateral Water Hazard*. If a ball is in or it is known or virtually certain that a ball that has not been found is in the hazard, the player may, as an additional option, drop a ball, under penalty of one stroke, in the dropping zone.
- * The stone wall surrounding the green is not an obstruction. It is an integral part of the course. If the wall causes the player to deem the ball unplayable, the player may, as additional option, drop a ball, under penalty of one stroke, in the dropping zone.
- 8 / 17 * The fence protecting the #4 tee, the rest room, and the pump house, are *Immovable Obstructions* (see Rule 24-2). Relief is one club length.
- 9 / 18 * The fence to the left of the fairway defines *Out of Bounds*.
- * The building and wire fence behind green, define *Out of Bounds*. If the building or the wire fence cause the player to deem the ball unplayable, the player may, as an additional option, drop a ball, under penalty of one stroke, in the dropping zone.
